When was telephone service regulation added to the Commission's responsibilities? Telephone service regulation was added to the Commission's responsibilities in 1996. In 1996, the legislature gave the Commission the power to mandate telephone service in areas of the state that needed it. Who manages Georgia's energy planning and cost-recovery proceedings? We believe everyone should have access to clean, safe, reliable, and affordable energy. As part of Georgia's constructive regulatory environment, our long-term energy planning process and cost-recovery proceedings are managed by the Georgia PSC. GA R& R In managing the Public Rights-of-Way obtained pursuant to the Department's authority, the Department requires Permits and accompanying fees for the installation of any private or public utility.

RULES OF GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF FEES FOR COMMUNICATION UTILITIES (1) Issuance of Permits. This Section 672-11-.04 applies only to Permits for use of the Public Rights-of-Way by Communications Utilities. The Department shall administer these rules.
