Sudan, [c] officially the Republic of the Sudan, [d] is a country in Northeast Africa. It borders the Central African Republic to the southwest, Chad to the west, Libya to the northwest, Egypt to the east, and Ethiopia to the south. Sudan is a large, landlocked country in northeastern Africa at the southern edge of the Sahara. Sudan's capital, Khartoum, is located roughly in the center of the country, at the junction of the Nile River and the Atbara River. Sudan plunged into a civil war in April after a vicious struggle for power broke out between its army and a powerful paramilitary group, the Rapid Support Forces (RSF).
